

The Kyocera Environmental Charter

By establishing the Kyocera Environmental Charter in 1991, Kyocera became one of Japan's first corporations to make a formal declaration of environmental commitment. The Charter clarifies Kyocera's intent to deal with global environmental problems and includes a comprehensive action plan. It is an extension of Kyocera's corporate philosophy of contributing to the well-being of individuals and communities.

The Kyocera Green Committee

The Kyocera Green Committee promotes a philosophy of harmonious coexistence and is the core body for implementing and promoting Kyocera's environmental preservation activities. Its subcommittees propose specific targets and measures through a number of sections. These subcommittees address a wide range of directives such as establishing stricter environmental standards than those stipulated by regulations and laws; reducing industrial waste; protecting the ozone layer; promoting energy conservation; promoting global-warming prevention activities; promoting resource conservation, and others. The Kyocera Affiliated Companies Green Committee supports individual companies throughout the Kyocera Group, helping them to carry out environmental directives based on the Kyocera Environmental Charter. Individually, Kyocera group companies perform local environmental preservation activities under the guidance of this committee.

We operate an energy conservation policy to ensure that all non-critical equipment is switched off when not needed. Energy efficiency is a key consideration in all purchasing decisions for electrical and electronic equipment.

We endeavour to perform business electronically, to reduce paper usage. Where paper must be used, we choose FSC-certified or recycled paper that is chlorine-free.


